

The **NEVADANS FOR FAIR RECOVERY ACT** ENSURES VICTIMS RECEIVE FAIR COMPENSATION BY CAPPING ATTORNEYS' FEES AT 20%

PROBLEM:

NEVADA TRIAL ATTORNEYS ARE GETTING RICH AT THE EXPENSE OF PLAINTIFFS AND EVERYONE ELSE.


Nevada billboard and television attorneys have spent hundreds of millions of dollars supporting a system that is rigged to benefit them at the expense of plaintiffs, Nevadans and businesses.

The result is a flawed system that benefits lawyers, but everyone else pays the price.

X VICTIMS PAY THE PRICE

Because there are few limits on legal fees, plaintiffs' **lawyers frequently take close to half** of all settlements and awards that are supposed to go to their clients. This leaves victims with little money to pay their medical bills or everyday expenses.

CONSUMERS AND BUSINESSES PAY THE PRICE A U.S. Chamber of Commerce study found that the U.S. tort system costs the average household \$3,621 per year in the form of higher costs for goods and services. And in part because of rampant lawsuits, Nevadans currently have some of the highest auto insurance costs in the country.



A recent report estimated that Nevada attorneys:

- X Spent more than \$130 million on TV, radio, print, digital and billboard advertisements in Nevada in 2023 alone.
- Contributed more than \$4.5 million to Nevada political candidates and causes since 2017.

THE NEVADANS FOR FAIR RECOVERY ACT HELPS ENSURE PLAINTIFFS RECEIVE FAIR COMPENSATION FROM LEGAL SETTLEMENTS AND AWARDS

The measure, aimed for the Nevada 2026 ballot:

Caps attorney contingency fees at 20% of all settlements and awards.



Ensures more money goes to plaintiffs and victims by guaranteeing they receive at least 80% of net settlements and awards if they win in court or settle.



Does not limit liability or the amount corporations or defendants must pay when they're found to be in the wrong. The measure caps what attorneys can take, but it does not limit total award and settlement amounts owed to plaintiffs by defendants.




Allows attorneys to continue receiving reimbursements for actual costs that occur when taking on a case, such as for hiring experts, conducting independent investigations, and other legal expenses.




Offers relief to consumers and working families who pay thousands per year in higher prices for everyday goods and services due to costly litigation.
